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The Chief Cornerstone: Rejected by Men; Established by God

"Coming to Him as to a living stone, rejected indeed by men, but chosen by God and precious, you also, as living stones, are being built up a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. Therefore, it is also contained in the Scripture, 'Behold, I lay in Zion, a Chief Cornerstone, elect, precious, And he who believes on Him will by no means be put to shame" (1 Peter 2:4-6, NKJV).

Despite being rejected by men - the religious leaders, the priests and the Pharisees, the Lord Jesus became the Foundation and Chief Cornerstone upon which Christianity stands.

Jesus Himself in the book of Matthew 21 as he addressed the multitudes among whom were the priests and the Pharisees, after telling the parable of the wicked vinedressers where a landowner sends servants who were beaten, stoned and killed, and, ultimately, he sends his son to collect the fruits from the vinedresser-tenants, trusting that he would be respected and honoured, but they rejected him, cast him out and killed him instead. The Lord Jesus concludes by citing Psalm 118:22-23, and said to them in Matthew 21:42:

"...Have you never read in the Scriptures: 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes'?"

He went on to say to them "Therefore I say to you, the Kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a nation bearing the fruits of it. And whoever falls on this stone will be broken; but on whomever it falls, it will grind him to powder." Now when the chief priests and Pharisees heard His parables, they perceived that He was speaking of them".

The Lord Jesus here spoke of Himself in the scriptures, signifying that He is the rejected stone who had become the Chief Cornerstone and Foundation of Kingdom of God.

In the Book of Acts 4, the Apostles were arrested after preaching and teaching people about Jesus and the resurrection from the dead, and after having healed a lame man in Chapter 3. They were brought before the Sanhedrin the next day. And the priests, the rulers, the elders, the scribes, sadduces etc. asked them, "By what power or by what name have you done this?" (Acts 4:7, NKJV).

'Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them' as recorded in the scriptures from verse 8 to 12 declaring "Rulers of the people and elders of Israel: ...let it be known to you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by Him this man stands here before you whole. This is the 'stone which was rejected by you builders, which has become the chief cornerstone.' Nor is there Salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."
